Every year individuals, churches and communities around the world unite to lift up students in prayer on the Universal Day of Prayer for Students (UDPS). This year that day falls on **15 February**. The UDPS is coordinated by the World Student Christian Federation (WSCF) and has been celebrated since 1898, making it one of the oldest ecumenical days of prayer.
