Elaine Heath: Elaine is Dean of Duke Divinity School, North Carolina and an Elder in the United Methodist Church. She has published a number of books, focussing on evangelism and spirituality, evangelism and gender, the new monasticism, and emergence in church and in theological education. She is also the co-founder of the [Missional Wisdom Foundation](#), which provides opportunities for clergy and laity to learn how to live in intentional communities and how to develop missional communities and social enterprise in diverse social contexts.



Roger Walton is an ordained presbyter in the British Methodist Church and currently Chair of the Yorkshire West Methodist District. As well as varied circuit appointments, Roger was Connexional Secretary for Adult Learning 1987-1999, then Director of the Wesley Study Centre, Durham. During 2016-17, Roger was the President of the British Methodist Conference. His research interests are in Christian education and a variety of topics concerning Discipleship and he has published several books on these subjects.

More about the theme...

Elaine: How can established congregations join in with the "new thing" that God is doing (Isaiah 43:18)? What are the skills, attitudes, and habits needed for clergy and laity to participate in God's work of renewal in the church, while holding fast to our grounding in Christ? I will guide us through these and related questions, drawing from my academic research and from leading and mentoring in a variety of new monastic and missional ministry settings.

Roger: New monastic communities are emerging all over the place at the moment, even in unlikely settings such as soft play initiatives, young people committed to social justice and among bankers! I will explore how such communities or groups form around a sense of call, provide corporate strength and accountability, include voices from the margins, and remain outward looking. In other words, how do Christ-centred rhythms and rules help us to grow into God's mission?
