This week's House of Lords vote on tax credits was about short-term cuts to people's benefits. The **Welfare Reform and Work Bill** currently going through parliament contains much larger cuts, as well as important changes to the core principles of the benefits system. Translated from the original Hebrew and Greek, <u>beibl.net</u>is the **Bible in everyday Welsh** – ideal for young people, those learning the language and native Welsh speakers. On 1 November, it will be published in print form - both as a full hardcover Bible, and also as a colour illustrated 365 story Bible. This is only the third ever full translation, following on from 1588 and 1988, and is the work of Arfon Jones and his team over a 15 year period.
