next week's mailing will be something of a Christmas video-fest!



An appealing Christmas

Grants for roofs and gutters

In the Chancellor's (3 December) Autumn Statement, a new, one-off grant scheme for roofs and gutters of listed places of worship was announced. Fifteen million pounds is available, for grants of between £10k and £100k. But the timescales for applications are exceptionally short - though if you are awarded a grant, you will then have reasonable time to complete the work. Fortunately you don't need to be too far down the road to apply, but anyone wishing to benefit from this will need to move fast, as applications have to be in **by the end of**January. There is a dedicated website here and the Church of England has published some guidance here.
