A joint letter has been sent to the **Home Secretary** from the leaders of five churches, including the Methodist Church, on changes to the policy on child refugees. The letter expresses concern at the government's recent announcement that it intends to **suspend the safe resettlement of unaccompanied minors** seeking refuge in the United Kingdom.
