StreetLink

On any given night there are estimated to be around **2,400 people sleeping rough** in England. StreetLink is a phone-line, website and mobile app that allows members of the public to send an alert when they're concerned about someone sleeping rough. StreetLink then passes the information to the relevant local authority or homelessness agency who can help get them the support they need. It's easy to use and just a few minutes can help turn someone's life around.
