## Concern over 'Punish a Muslim' day

The Christian Muslim Forum (CMF) has issued guidance for those wanting to support their Muslim brothers and sisters as 'Punish A Muslim' day approaches next Tuesday (April 3). As featured in the news in recent weeks, letters and social media messages have been distributed encouraging acts of violence against Muslims.

The Methodist Church believes that hatred and racism is a sin. As a recent booklet from <u>Churches Together in Britain and Ireland</u> says, "Christians should continue to build relationships of respect and trust with people of different religions so as to facilitate deeper mutual understanding, reconciliation and cooperation for the common good."

CMF suggests that Christians text or ring their Muslim friends ahead of April 3 to say that they are aware of the letter, that they understand from the police that there is currently no credible threat, but should the need arise, they are ready to support their friends, as a simple gesture of friendship and solidarity.

Various police forces around the country and Tell Mama, an independent, non-governmental organisation which works on tackling anti-Muslim hatred, have issued guidelines for anyone concerned about the day. <a href="https://tellmamauk.org/resources/">https://tellmamauk.org/resources/</a>
