Today, the Methodist Church joined with other Churches to call for an end to the 'hostile environment'. This is a web of policies designed to make life so difficult for people who do not have a legal right to be in the UK that they will leave voluntarily. The new report demonstrates that this causes destitution, discrimination and distrust.
