Members of the Connexional Team and many willing volunteers are getting ready for the 2019 Conference which takes place in Birmingham from Thursday 27 June – Thursday 4 July. The Revd Dr Jonathan Hustler has been

stationed as Secretary of the Conference following the departure of the Revd Gareth Powell.

The Conference first met in 1744 under John Wesley, who gathered together his assistants to talk about 'what to teach, how to teach, and what to do'. The contemporary Conference is the governing body of the Methodist Church, made up of representatives from each Methodist District, along with some who have been elected by the Conference, ex officio members and representatives of the Youth Assembly and other connexional bodies.

Representatives are a mixture of lay people, ordained presbyters and deacons and this year 306 representatives and 24 associate members will attend.
