Reviewing our Ministry?

The Methodist Conference of 2018 modified the Duties and Responsibilities of Local Preachers in Standing Order 563 and accepted a recommendation that "all preachers should undertake peer review of their ministry every three years". We have produced two Guidance Notes to help Local Preachers' Meetings to provide opportunities for us to review our ministry. They are available here.

Why two Guidance Notes? The first, entitled "Reviewing our Ministry" explores what the Conference requires by "Reviewing our Ministry" and what the revised Standing Orders mean in practice. The second, called "Peer Review" for Local Preachers" looks specifically at how we can support and encourage each other through opportunities for review and feedback. Each circuit will need to work out the best process for them, but we are encouraged that those circuits who have already embraced peer review have found it a very encouraging experience.

Young Local Preachers Event



WORSHIP: LEADING & PREACHING

WLP @ Cliff

In 2019 we shall be offering *two* residential schools at Cliff College in Derbyshire for those who are studying using Worship: Leading & Preaching. Each lasts from Monday to Friday and offers the Explore sessions from the appropriate modules, together with worship and fellowship in the beautiful Derbyshire countryside. Note that you will need to have completed the "Prepare" material before you arrive to make sense of the sessions.

Spring School takes place from 25 to 29 March (inclusive) and will offer the "Explore" sessions from Modules 3 & 4, 5 & 6 and 7 & 8.

Summer School will be from 5 to 9 August and will cover Modules 1 & 2, 3 & 4 and 5 & 6.

Both offer an opportunity to share together with other Worship Leaders and Local Preachers in training. For bookings, and more information, see the Cliff College website here.

In addition, starting in September 2019, we are offering an opportunity to do "WLP in a Year". This will be based around the Spring and Summer Schools, plus three additional residential weekends. Students, who must already have a Note to Preach, will train in their local circuit with a tutor and mentor, coming to Cliff College for the Explore sessions. An alternative, fully residential option will also be available. Note that all students will need to be sure they can complete the Prepare material themselves within the required deadlines. A Date to Remember - 31 March 2019

This is the next closing date for moderation of portfolios. Well before then, you should upload your portfolio to Moodle and provide a copy to your tutor. Your tutor needs to download the Portfolio Assessment & Moderation Form, complete it and send it to the regional moderator and the Local Preachers' Office. Note that this form has been revised and renamed, but the old version will still be accepted.

Portfolios can be uploaded on to the Moodle site and sent to Tutors at any time, well in advance of this date. Please be kind and give your tutor plenty of time to complete their assessment. Note that the deadline is final, and any portfolios received later than 31 March will be deferred to the next moderation period.


For those of you submitting Faith & Worship assignments the deadlines for submitting work to Methodist Church House are unchanged:
