The La Soufrière volcano on the Caribbean island of St. Vincent began a series of eruptions on the 9 April, sending clouds of ash 20,000 feet into the air, blanketing much of the island in ash and causing water and electricity outages.





Guidance

The government has updated the <u>Safe Use of Places of Worship</u> guidance to include details of how restrictions will be lifted for churches in England. Updates for <u>Step 2</u> on 12 April 2021 included:

Funerals are limited to 30 people



Weddings & civil partnership ceremonies, wakes and wedding receptions are limited to 15 people
Children and youth activities are allowed
