### Reconciliation and Mediation Pilot Project



The Methodist Church has launched a Reconciliation and Mediation pilot project in partnership with the charity Place for Hope. The pilot, running from 2021-2023, will provide a trained team of 20 accredited reconcilers and mediators to support groups and individuals at times of change or conflict, and to accompany sensitive or difficult group conversations. ## **Guidance**



The government has updated the <u>Safe Use of Places of Worship</u> guidance to include details of how restrictions will be lifted for churches in England. Updates for <u>Step 2</u> on 12 April 2021 included:

Funerals are limited to 30 people, weddings & civil partnership ceremonies, wakes and wedding receptions are limited to 15 people. Children and youth activities are allowed.
