Good Friday and Easter Sunday Reflections


The Revd Sonia Hicks, President of the Methodist Conference, has recorded a prayer for Good Friday and a reflection for Easter Sunday - both are available here.

The Methodist Church reaffirms its opposition to Conversion Therapy

The Methodist Council has reaffirmed its opposition to Conversion Therapy in any form at its recent Council Meeting. The Revd Michaela Youngson said, "The Methodist Church position is that, regardless of government decisions, it is not permitted for conversion therapy, including trans conversion therapy to take place on Methodist premises, and that no conversion therapy can take place in the name of the Methodist Church." 
We have a detailed toolkit of practical advice and support for churches who wish to offer the gift of sanctuary to people fleeing the war in Ukraine.
