Overcoming the hardships of rural ministry

"The Methodist Church is constantly finding ways to provide income-generating ideas that are sustainable and can be of benefit both to the church and the local community. Chickenrearing projects are a popular means of income-generation in Africa. Chicken is the most popular meat consumed. They are easy and cheap to breed and a 6 week old chick can be sold for US\$1, which in rural Africa is not far off a day's wage for some."
