### **Cost of Living and Gambling**



Research published by Gamble Aware last week found that out of 1,6000 surveyed, a quarter of women aged 18-49 who gamble are expecting to gamble more in the coming months due to the cost-of-living crisis, with one in ten reportedly already having turned to gambling in an attempt to supplement household income.

#### **New Webinar Series**




Great leaders are transformational: they long to see their churches and communities flourish and start to look more like the Kingdom of God.
