
IICSA Update

The Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse has published the final report of its hearings and investigations today. The report makes twenty recommendations which the Methodist Church will now study in detail.

The Secretary of the Conference, the Revd Dr Jonathan Hustler said: "We are grateful to the Chair and Panel for putting survivors at the forefront of their investigations and recommendations and thank them for their work. The scale of abuse (some of it in religious institutions) uncovered by the Inquiry is both shocking and shameful and we have listened to harrowing stories of where children have been let down."
