Dealing with Conflict



The Methodist Conference has voted to roll out a scheme to help resolve disputes in church communities across the Church following a successful pilot project. The Conference adopted the recommendation

for the five-year programme, in partnership with *Place for Hope*, to offer an integrated approach in support of Positive Working Together and extending the Reconciliation and Mediation Team as a Connexion-wide programme.

The <u>Reconciliation and Mediation Team Pilot Project</u> is run with *Place for Hope* and started two and a half years ago in three regions, with 18 mediators now qualified to work on the project.

A Justice-Seeking Church



The Methodist Conference, which has been taking place in Birmingham this week, has overwhelmingly voted to recommit the Methodist Church to being a Justice-seeking Church.

The report received by the Conference hopes to encourage more Methodists in acting for justice, along with their local communities, and to focus efforts on contributing to change in key areas including poverty, refugees, the environment, discrimination and peace.

The report is the result of a two-year process of conversation and listening. This involved looking at how Methodists have worked for justice throughout their history and what is being done now, as well as hearing people's experiences of injustice. The report involved churches, young people, communities and schools sharing their visions of what a just world looks like.

Global Relationships Pre-Conference Consultation

The pre-Conference consultation of the Global Relationships team of the Methodist Church in Britain took place on Tuesday 20 and Wednesday 21 June. Twenty representatives from partner churches around the world arrived in London to prepare for the Methodist Conference, which is being held this week in Birmingham.



The consultation was a chance to prepare representatives to participate and talk into the Methodist Conference.

The pre-consultation was also a chance to share about the work of churches around the world and to learn about mission in the context of other countries, and to hear of their successes and their challenges. Partners were invited to share the topics that were of concern to them including issues around the environment, migration and diversity.

the Global Relationships team to facilitate and strengthen ongoing relationships between Partner Churches and the Methodist Church in Britain.

Methodist Youth President Encourages Involvement with Young People

James Carver, Methodist Youth President 2022-2023, presented the 3Generate report to the Methodist Conference on Tuesday 20 June. The report highlighted the success of last year's 3Generate Children and Youth Assembly while emphasising the vital role youth ministry plays in the life of the wider Church.

Detailing the success of 3Generate 2022, it was announced that the event held at the NEC in Birmingham last year was the biggest yet, with over 1200 children and young people, 456 group leaders, and 252 volunteers joining together to share and be in communion with God.

Identifying some of the discussions that took place at 3Generate, the report encourages all Methodists to understand the importance of shared learning in the development of children and young people's faith story.


