#### Call for a ceasefire

Christian Aid, along with other organisations and churches, have issued a joint statement saying that a permanent ceasefire would be the only way to deliver necessary aid to Gaza.

"We need a full and permanent ceasefire now. There is no military solution to this conflict. Instead, we are seeing our worst fears realised of a 'pause bomb, pause bomb' scenario. This is dehumanising, unacceptable and offers little room for hope or the conditions to achieve a lasting peace."

UNBOUNDED love doesn't stay in the lines

A range of resources that connect the Gospel readings from the Sunday lectionary throughout Lent to weekly themes, each one a line lifted from the hymn "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling."

Charles Wesley's famous hymn Love Divine, All Loves Excelling talks about Jesus as 'unbounded love' – a kind of love that cannot be contained, that works in our lives and in our world to free us and heal us. Unbounded Love is the theme of the Lent campaign of the Methodist Church in 2024 – holding together our commitments to be a justice-seeking church, and a people who experience and proclaim the good news of God's uncontainable love.

For individuals - Forty daily discipleship prompts, delivered straight to your email inbox every day of Lent, excluding Sundays. Daily emails will include Bible studies, creative activities and challenges to take action.

For churches - A poster to advertise the email reflections, digital assets to advertise the email reflections, light-touch guidance for either Sunday services or small groups and a social media campaign pointing people to local churches.


## Church leaders oppose the Illegal Migration Bill
