Exploring Digital Lunchtime Learning



On Tuesday 20 February from 12noon-1pm, we enter into the world of online church and online community - what can we learn about being an inclusive church? Can we create authentic relationships online? Laura Neale, Founder and Director of YouBelong says:

"I set up YouBelong in January 2019 and rapidly realised that there are thousands of people like me, who cannot attend an onsite church or connect in with a church community due to chronic illness and disability. As wonderful as onsite church settings are for many people, for others, they are inaccessible, not just due to physical barriers like a lack of ramps, loop systems or accessible toilets, but also due to the lack of understanding of disability and chronic illness from a theological and Christian standpoint.

"During this session, I hope to teach and equip you to pastor and care for chronically ill and disabled people in your church and community."
