We are shocked by the terrorist attack against two men in Golders Green yesterday. We stand with our brothers and sisters in the Jewish community. Antisemitism is evil and wrong, and we continue to express sadness and concern about the rise of antisemitic attacks in the UK.

As a Church we are committed to opposing antisemitism, and stand by all who are discriminated against or persecuted on the grounds of their religion or ethnicity. We recognise that as a Church we need to be vigilant about our own language, voice and actions, and continue to repent and learn from past wrongs. We seek to be an inclusive and justice-seeking Church that challenges antisemitism and all forms of discrimination.
